

Project Name: **Johnstown Flood National Memorial & Fort Necessity National Battlefield**

Authorizing Agency: Northeast Exotic Plant Mgmt Team National Park Service
Approximate Acreage: 40 Acres

IPC has been working with various National Parks throughout the eastern US since its inception. And began working with the NE EPMT 2 years ago primarily at Ft. Necessity National Battlefield and Johnstown Flood National Memorial. The Johnstown Flood site was approximately 23 Acres and involved the treatment of multiflora rose on a hillside overlooking Johnstown River flood plain as well as the treatment of multiflora rose and bush honeysuckle in the flood plain of Johnstown River. The Fort Necessity project involved treating approximately 15 Acres of bush honeysuckle in prime woodcock habitat.
